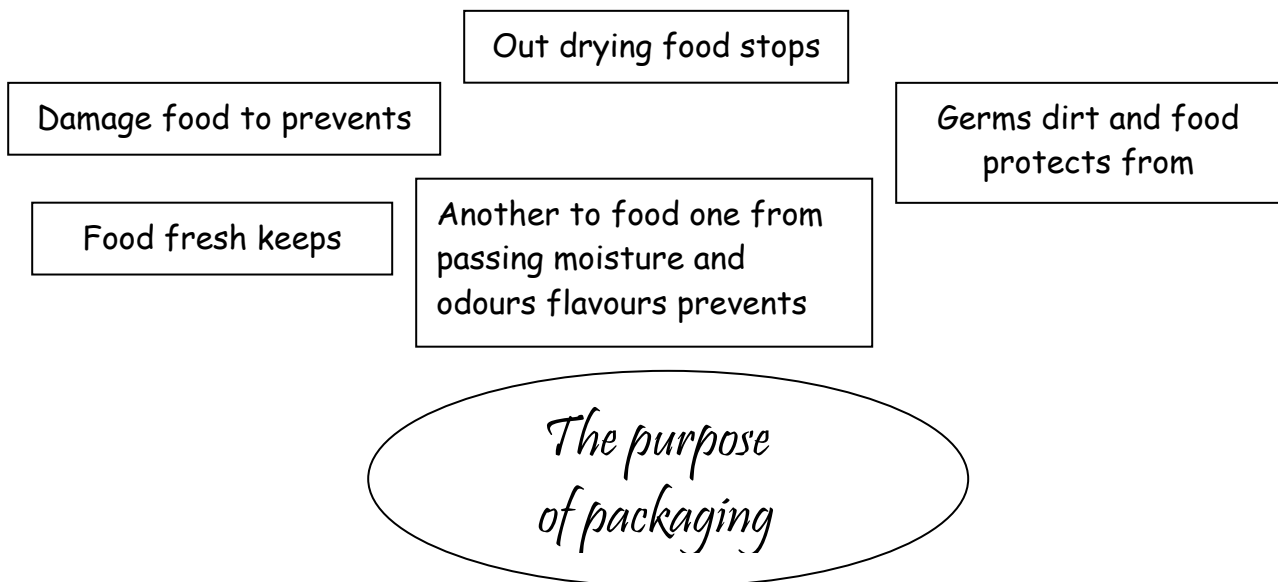


# Packing for a picnic
